

Background

Construction firms operate in an increasingly competitive and dynamic environment. In order to adjust to new ways of working, organisational change is required; but how easy is it to implement change? What are the barriers to change?

Change management comes in many forms and guises although, however necessary change is, it is only as good as the acceptance by individuals of their new found responsibilities. The adjustments in power/knowledge in particular can be a contentious issue.

This workshop will look at some of the key influences on the extent change is accepted and embedded across organisations, including: the effect change has on existing project management practice and the extent to which this change represents a shift in power / knowledge within an organisation.

It will draw upon experienced individuals who have implemented or studied change within organisations, who will recount the lessons learnt in overcoming the static inertia which exists within the industry.
